About this unit of competency	<p>Description of course: This unit deals with the skills and knowledge required to provide an advanced first aid response, including management of the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.</p> <p>The unit applies to workers who may be required to provide, coordinate and manage a first aid response across a range of complex situations, include community and workplace settings.</p> <p>Applicable Industries:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergency responders • Lifesaving • Childcare • Education • Medical professionals • Construction • Many more
Training Program	<p>This course is delivered as a one day face-to-face training session with pre-study.</p> <p>Pre-requisite: A current Apply First Aid HLTA311A, Provide First Aid HLTAID003 or Apply Advanced First Aid HLTA412A certificate must be supplied upon enrolment.</p> <p>We offer public attendance courses at our Sydney CBD training centre on George St.</p> <p><i>If your organisation is interested in a private / in-house booking to have this course delivered to a group of staff, please contact our head office to discuss booking options. The delivery can be programmed to fit in with your staff and company schedule, at your venue or ours.</i></p>
Assessment requirements	<p>Physical Requirements: It is important to note that this course requires a level of physical ability to complete practical assessments. All students are required to perform 2 minutes of CPR on an adult manikin and baby manikin on the floor. In addition to this, all students must perform 2 minutes of bag-valve-mask resuscitation and 2 minutes of compressions only resuscitation. If your health or fitness will not allow you to demonstrate this, you will not be awarded a nationally accredited certificate for HLTAID006 Provide Advanced First Aid. We can however issue a non accredited certificate of attendance for Advanced First Aid. Students are advised to check if this option meets their workplace / industry requirements before attending the training.</p> <p>Foundation Skills: Oral communication – in order to make an accurate verbal report to supervisor and emergency response services Written communication – in order to complete a written incident report in line with organisational policies</p>

Delivery and Assessments	<p>This course is made up of two components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Pre-study (approx. 6 hours) 2) Face-to-face training (approx. 8 hours) <p><u>PRESTUDY:</u> Full instructions available in the student learning portal.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Online first aid manuals • Online first aid demonstration videos • Online workbooks (multiple choice quizzes) • Student declaration - must be completed once pre-study is finished <p><u>FACE-TO-FACE:</u> Learners will be assessed on the following topic areas</p> <p>Skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Safe manual handling • Identify hazards • Perform CPR (8 consecutive minutes each on an infant and adult manikin) • Unpack and use an AED • Place a casualty in the recovery position • Complete an incident report log • Perform a secondary examination • Apply first aid – bandaging, slings, wound care, management of medical/trauma emergencies • Provide an accurate verbal report of the incident • Direct other first aiders • Basic triage • Debriefing • Spinal management with the use of a cervical collar and backboard <p>Knowledge topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regulations/codes of practice • Safe work practice • Legal considerations in first aid • Basic anatomy and physiology • Considerations when providing CPR and first aid • Chain of survival • Correct use of the AED • Physiology relating to response/consciousness • How to recognise signs and symptoms of common illness and injury

Assessment submission process, support and outcomes	<p>Assessment Outcomes: Competent or Not Competent</p> <p>For any learner who is unable to competently complete all assessment tasks, the facilitator will attempt to make reasonable adjustments to the methods of assessment. If the learner is still deemed not competent, they will need to re-sit the training course and additional fees will apply.</p>
Recognition of Prior Learning	<p>Students choosing to undertake RPL will need to be sent an RPL guide for their course.</p> <p>In order to be eligible for RPL, the student must demonstrate <i>currency</i> in that particular subject. I.e. a student cannot submit evidence from 5 years prior and request it be applied directly to their new competency. They must show how they have since applied those skills and that they are current.</p>
Course completion	<p>Once a competent mark is issued for all assessment activities, learners will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for HLTAID006 Provide Advanced First Aid & HLTAID007 Provide Advanced Resuscitation.</p> <p>These Units of Competency are Nationally Recognised Training from Health Training Package.</p>
